Information

There were no staff introductions and no public comments.

The Director's Report included

- Ms. Terry and Ms. Young's report on attending the KBR site visit to DSS on October 11
- 8 DSS staff and 2 Board members will attend the 89th Annual Social Services Institute on October 26-28 in Hickory, NC
- Forsyth County may lose TANF Block Grant which will impact CPS

Consent

The September Minutes were approved on a motion by Mr. Plyler, second by Ms. Young

Strategic

- The Director will develop a strategy for a community conversation with about 6 – 10 Forsyth stakeholders to discuss child care funding
- Food and Nutrition grows by approximately 120 cases per month and is at approximately 900 caseloads per worker
- The agency's automation efforts continue to make progress, issues change daily, and more than half of FNS staff are using FAMIS
- The NC Fast Initiative
 - Still projected for a February 2012 pilot in 5 counties (not Forsyth)
 - It is extremely concerning that the state has changed their intention to allow counties to upload data from local county case management systems: instead counties are being forced to use NCFast on the front end: additionally. Counties will have to manually enter case data (at the normal review cycle) to get data into NCFast: this means that Forsyth will spend 15 minutes to 75 minutes per cases (FNS has 25,000 cases) manually entering this data after NCFast goes live
- The Director has been assisting the state and NCACDSS plan a Strategic Leadership Summit to discuss the massive amount of changes (technology, program consolidation and, simplification, child welfare, etc.) heading to local DSS's in the next few years
